Very Reverend Father!<sup>1</sup>

In accordance with your wishes, we have already written to Vienna. The superior<sup>2</sup> there will inform you of the day and the hour of her arrival in Altheim-Obernberg.

Unfortunately, we cannot accommodate your second expressed wish. To apply for the teaching position in Roßbach contradicts our faithfully held principle that we only go "where Divine Providence calls us." We have never applied for a place and we cannot do so now. Nevertheless, we will pray that if the pastor requests that the teaching position in Roßbach be given to the Poor School Sisters, all will take place in accordance with God's holy will.

In case you would like to correspond with the superior in Vienna about the trip, we are enclosing her address. We gave her the directive to wait for another call from you.

Very Reverend Father!

We just received word from Vienna asking that we would send the certificates for the sisters proposed for Roßbach. We have them here and therefore I hasten to send them directly by return mail.

M. Evarista (Margaret) Endres is the appointed teacher because she passed the examination for elementary subjects and needlework in Austria, as her certificate indicates.

We are also enclosing Sister Clara Kraus's certificate, which she acquired after working five years in Orb.<sup>3</sup> She is also a certified teacher, but she passed her examination in Prussia and not in Austria. We are sending her as a companion sister because, in accordance with our statutes, we do not send one sister alone. Sister Clara can assist the appointed teacher.
