



CERTIFICATE OF NATURALIZATION.

BE IT REMEMBERED, That at a District Court of the United States for the District of Wisconsin, in the United States of America, on the *ninth* day of *January* in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and *fifty six* held at *Milwaukee* before the Judge thereof, *Mary Caroline Fries* a native of *Barania* exhibited a petition praying to be admitted to become a Citizen of the United States; and it appearing to the said Court that she had declared on oath, before the *Circuit* ^{Court of the United States} *Maryland* ^{Court for the} *District* of *Maryland* on the *Twenty second* day of *June* Ob. D. 1857; that it was bona-fide her intention to become a Citizen of the United States, and to renounce forever all allegiance or fidelity to any foreign Prince, Potentate, State, or Sovereignty whatever, and particularly to *The King of Barania*, of whom she was at that time a *subject* and the said *Mary Caroline Fries* having on his solemn oath declared, and also made proof thereof by competent testimony of *John B Hoeger and Joseph Zander* Citizens of the United States, that she had resided one year and upwards in the State of Wisconsin, and within the United States of America upwards of five years immediately preceding ^{her} application; and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court, that during that time she had behaved as ^{an} ~~as~~ man of good moral character, attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same; and having on his solemn oath declared, before the said Court, that she would support the Constitution of the United States, and that she did absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to every foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty whatever, and particularly to *Maximilian King of Barania* of whom he was before *a subject* Thereupon the Court admitted the said *Mary Caroline Fries* to become a Citizen of the United States, and ordered all the proceedings aforesaid to be recorded by the Clerk of the said Court; and which was done accordingly.
